Currently, she serves on the House Rules, State Government and Education committees. During her teaching career, Dr. Boyd primarily taught at the Calhoun County Training School (currently C.E. Hanna Elementary) and Weaver Elementary School. The Community Foundation is honored to assist Rep. Boyd in furthering her commitment to the residents of Calhoun County.

## Piedmont Education Trust Joins The Community Foundation

In 1991 an educational trust was formed to benefit the Piedmont School System. Now this trust, named the **Piedmont Education Trust** has evolved into 16 separate scholarship funds and awards grants to teachers in the school system. This year \$18,000 in scholarships were awarded to 14 graduating seniors who will attend various colleges. The fund will also distribute school based grants to purchase supplies and materials in late July. **Dr. Cynthia Harper**, Chairperson of the Board for the Piedmont Education Trust is pleased with the fund's success. "I have seen this fund grow and I have witnessed the ambitions and success of students do the same," Dr. Harper stated, "We are delighted with our decision to become affiliated with the Community Foundation."

## Foundation Distributes \$552,912 in Grant Awards

the applications from all organizations as we strive to support various priorities; unfortunately, resources do not allow the Board to address all of the the worthy needs in our community.”

The new multi-year grant recipients include, the **Boys and Girls Club of East Central Alabama**, who will initiate a program of prevention and education addressing HIV and AIDS among area youth; **Interfaith Ministries, Inc** will use their funds to provide home delivered well-balanced nutritional meals to elderly residents; **All Saints Interfaith Center of Concern** plans to provide out-of-pocket health expenditures for indigent individuals and families; and the **Calhoun/Cleburne Children’s Center, Inc.** will hire a full time Master’s level counselor to fill a dual role of counseling victims of child abuse and to collaborate with the LINC Program to further connect families through their family intervention program.

The Community Foundation Board met on May 4, 2004 and finalized \$185,912 in grant distributions from the Stringfellow Health Fund. **Mr. Forrest French**, Chair of the Grant Review Committee, states: “We understand and value

## Charitable Remainder Trusts

Do you have a highly appreciated asset with a low tax basis that produces little or no income? Would you like to make that asset a productive one, earning increased income for the remainder of your life, your spouse's life, and perhaps a child's as well, and at the same time have an immediate charitable deduction that will reduce your taxes *now*? If so, you should ask your tax advisor about the *charitable remainder trust* (CRT).

Best of all, the highly appreciated asset will completely avoid the capital gains tax, bypass the probate court since a CRT is a contract, and remove these assets from potential estate taxation.

A charitable remainder trust can be either a *charitable remainder unitrust* or a *charitable remainder annuity trust*. If you would like fixed income, then the charitable remainder annuity trust is what you want. However, I recommend the charitable remainder unitrust that will produce a variable income stream that increases as the trust increases in value.

The charitable remainder unitrust's (CRUT) income stream is based on a fixed percentage of the net fair market value of the trust's assets as determined at the end of each year. A qualified CRUT can provide for a distribution each year of five percent or the trust income, whichever is lower. Additional contributions can be made to a CRUT at any time. Also, a CRUT is exempt from tax in most circumstances. Thus, the trust can take your low income producing asset, sell it tax free, and reinvest the proceeds in other assets that will provide an increased income stream.

The charitable tax deduction is based on the life expectancy of the beneficiaries and can be used in the year the trust is funded. And, just as the name of the trust implies, the charitable organization, such as the Calhoun County Community Foundation, will receive the remaining assets of the trust at the death of the last beneficiary. If the Community Foundation is the beneficiary, the remaining assets can then be added to a permanent fund at the Foundation. You name the fund and have the security that the Foundation will professionally manage your fund and continue your charitable intentions.

The tax rules for a CRUT can be quite complicated, so should you decide that you are interested in creating such a trust, your tax advisor is the person you need to see.
